Attendance and Punctuality



Our school gates are open from **8:40am** until **8:55am**, and open again at **3:10pm** when school finishes.

The register for the first session will be taken at 8:55am and will be kept open by the class teacher until 9:00am. Following this, any late arrivals will be recorded by staff in the office who will record and update any changes on arrival.

Absence

Parents must notify the school on each day of absence by 8:45am or as soon as practically possible.

When phoning school to inform of your child's absence, please press 1 on the menu unless you need to speak to the office staff. When leaving a message, please clearly state your child's name, class and the reason for their absence.

If your child has sickness/diarrhoea, they must not attend school for 24 hours after the bout of symptoms.

Medical or Dental Appointments

Missing registration for a medical or dental appointment is counted as an authorised absence if the office has been informed of the appointment in advance.

However, we encourage parents to make medical and dental appointments out of school hours where possible. Where this is not possible, the pupil should be out of school for the minimum amount of time necessary.

We request that an appointment card is shown at the office in advance of the appointment so the class teacher can be informed.

Holidays During Term Time

Taking holidays in term time will affect a child's schooling as much as any other absence and we expect parents to help us by not taking children away during term time.

If you need to request a holiday during term time, then you will need to complete a Leave of Absence form which can be obtained from the school office.

Although the school will look at each request for leave on its own merit, requests will only be authorised for exceptional circumstances.

When taking your child out of school when a holiday is not authorised/requested, you may face legal action under Section 444 (1) or (1A) of the Education Act 1966 or be issued with a Penalty Notice under Section 23 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003.

Penalty Notices are issued **per parent**, **per child** at £80 each if paid within 21 days and rising to £160 each if paid within 28 days. Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will result in the Local Authority taking legal action against you under Section 444 (1) of the Education Act 1966.

The full version of our attendance policy can be found on the school website. We appreciate your cooperation in supporting your child's attendance and punctuality. Regular school attendance enhances their learning experience and helps them achieve their full potential.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding attendance, please do not hesitate to contact the school office. Together, let's ensure every school day is filled with enriching educational experiences for our children.



Information on Statutory Assessments



As we come to the end of the Spring term, we would like to keep you informed about the upcoming assessments that will be taking place for our students during the Summer term.

It is important for students to be well-prepared for these assessments, and we encourage parents to support their children during this time.

Key Stage Two Statutory Exams for Year 6:

Our Year 6 pupils will be undertaking the Key Stage Two statutory exams, which are a crucial part of their educational journey. These exams include assessments in Reading; Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling; and Mathematics. The tests are designed to measure the children's ability to apply their knowledge in these key areas of the curriculum. We encourage parents to support their children by ensuring they have ample time for revision and rest.

The timetable for the KS2 SATs for Year 6 in 2025 is as follows;

Monday 12th May 2025 - English Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling Paper 1 and Paper 2

Tuesday 13th May 2025 - English Reading Paper

Wednesday 14th May 2025 - Mathematics Paper 1 and Paper 2

Thursday 15th May 2025 - Mathematics Paper 3

Phonics Screening for Year 1:

The phonics screening check for Year 1 is a short assessment to ensure that children are making sufficient progress with their phonics skills to read words. It is not a formal test but a way for teachers to identify if any additional support is needed. The check consists of 40 words, both real and pseudo-words, that your child will read to a teacher. We recommend that parents engage in regular reading practices with their children to build their phonics skills.

The Phonics Screening Check for Year 1 will take place within the 1-week period starting from **Monday 9th June 2025**

Multiplication Screening for Year 4:

Year 4 pupils will participate in the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). This check is designed to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. The MTC is an online, on-screen assessment where pupils will answer questions on time tables 2 to 12. We advise parents to help their children practice their multiplication tables regularly.

The Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) for Year 4 will be administered within the 2-week period starting from **Monday 2nd June 2025**

We understand that assessments can be a source of anxiety for some students, and we aim to support them through this period with additional resources and guidance. Please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher if you have any concerns or require further information.

Spring Prayer


